President's Report



In the last twelve months we've seen some amazing changes in the Devonport landscape, both literally and figuratively - cranes dot the skyline in the CBD with the commencement of Stage 1 of Devonports CBD master plan and the new flagship store for food icons Hillstreet Grocers opens its doors in just a few months. Politically of course we have a new Member for Braddon, Justine Keay MP, whom we congratulate and look forward to working with over the coming years and we say farewell and thanks to Brett Whiteley and Richard Colbeck for their support and consultation with DCCI members on key issues during their term.

So amidst all the change, what are the opportunities for Devonport? Clearly tourism numbers and retail spending are on the rise and for agribusiness, with the exception perhaps of our dairy industry, things are in great shape, helped by a low dollar, freight equalisation scheme and burgeoning international appetite for our high quality produce. No wonder back in May business confidence in Tasmania topped the nation.

And yet, if we are to make the most of these conditions, every business needs to be at its most productive and generating the income needed for business expansion and the all important 'rainy day' fund we all tap into to keep staff employed and bills paid during the not so good times. It is my particular concern at the moment that our retail sector is under-prepared for the opportunities on the horizon and this is where the chamber will be focusing our advocacy, business events and media in the coming months.

We need a strategic plan for our existing retail to ensure our mainstreets are vibrant and appealing and above all, professionally marketed to both locals and tourists. In February we brought the Executive Officer of Mainstreets Australia - the peak body for mainstreet marketing - over to set out the case for a Precinct Association. On behalf of our Retail Committee I have presented twice to the Aldermen of Devonport Council this year to obtain funding for a facilitator to inform and engage local retailers, - we will keep exploring funding opportunities to see this project through. Retail is the largest employer in our local economy and generates the highest percentage of GRP - we simply must have a strategic plan in place to avoid an "old versus new" scenario when Stage 1 of the CBD plan is complete and it's been encouraging in the last few months we've been able to add some new talent to our retail committee to assist in discussions.

It's my great privilege to sit on the Executive Committee with a team of eight volunteers who are gracious enough to provide their time, wise counsel and ideas. Special thanks to our office bearers, Senior Vice President, Julie Foster, Vice President Rod Bramich and Treasurer Anthony Tait. I am very pleased that all of the Executive are returning in 2017, with the exception of our immediate past President Sylvia Sayers. After eighteen years of service to the DCCI, Sylvia has decided to focus her

considerable skills squarely on her media business, which I completely understand, although her insights and incredible drive will be sorely missed. I'd also like to make special note of our sub-committees and chairs Erica Hay - Young Leaders Committee and Brian Chandler - Industry and Innovation Committee for bringing together so many professionals across a broad range of industries. This year Erica and her team hosted discussions with Mayor Steve Martin, Devonport City Council- Assistant General Manager Matthew Atkins, Beacon representative Phil Matthews and Devonport Show Society – Meghan Shearer.

Brian's Industry Group has had presentations from Roger Jaench MP, Lara Hendriks - Department of State Growth, Rose Fishwick - Beacon Foundation, and completed the first of many planned site tours with a visit to Huon Aquaculture - an informed and well connected committee will always be better placed to provide strategic advice on policy to government and we congratulate the committees on their efforts.

We are of course kept on the straight and narrow by the Chamber Secretary, Tina Treloar, who has seamlessly taken on additional marketing duties this year with our restructure. Thanks also to Lynn Laycock for her superb efforts in the role of Marketing Executive up until January this year.

Events delivered this year have featured; Nick Nikitaris – Hill Street Grocer, David Cox – Tasmanian Operations Manager for Hawthorn, Big Guns of Industry luncheon with Peter Rockliff, Stephen Farquer and Royce Fairbrother, Thursty Thinks, CGU Golf Day, Nicole Maslin – Mainstreets Australia, Michael Bailey - CEO TCCI, Courtney Greisbach – Editor of The Advocate, Kelly O'Dwyer MP, Budget Dinner with the Hon Peter Gutwein, Geotrail report author Bob Campbell, and finally a luncheon with entrepreneur Dale Elphinstone.

Tina works out of the Devonport Corporate Centre in dual administration roles for the DCCI and the DCC and I'd like to thank her for the enormous effort she's put into this role. I'd also like to make a special acknowledgment to Ken Overton who provides such a great office environment as well as financial support towards the Secretary's role. I have spent a lot of time with my esteemed counterparts from the BCCI, CCCI and TCCI this year and I can safely say we have one of the best models in the state!

Premier's Message

The Liberal Government continues to deliver on its long-term Plan for Tasmania with the economy now growing, businesses expanding and investors buying in. As a strong, stable majority Liberal Government we are united in our determination to see our State reach its full potential.



As a result of our good financial management the budget is heading to a surplus of \$77.3 million this year, three years ahead of schedule. This means that we are now in a position to reinvest in essential services such as health, education and protecting the vulnerable while continuing to strengthen the economy and help create jobs.

The economy grew last year at the fastest rate in six years, building approvals are up, retail trade is at record levels, exports have grown to almost \$3 billion and more tourists are visiting our island than ever before.

We are also making sure that regional Tasmania shares in the benefits so we have invested an additional \$30 million in the Northern Cities Major Development Initiative bringing the spend to \$90 million. We have further supported regional areas and jobs through a new \$13.9 million Community Infrastructure Fund announced in this year's budget.

The Liberal Government invested in the refurbishment of the Spirits; we have seen reductions in average fare prices and a massive increase in the number of day sailings. These excellent passenger results are also generating solid cash returns and the Government has announced the creation of a dedicated fund for the replacement of the ships.

We have increased passenger numbers on the Spirits of Tasmania by 25 per cent in just three years, from 333 000 in 2012-2013 to around 415 000 in 2015-2016.

We all know that passengers on the Spirits visit the regions, they stay in Tasmania longer and they spend more on average in our State than those who come by air.

There is no doubt that it has been a tough year for the State and the challenges we have faced with the combination of bushfires, drought, floods and the energy crisis has been unprecedented. But the worst of times have brought out the very best in Tasmanians.

My Government has responded to these challenges with a measured and responsible approach. This is what Tasmanians rightly expect of us and since we came to office we have delivered what we promised. A strong, stable Liberal Majority Government will continue to deliver for Devonport and the wider North-West Coast by strengthening the economy, creating jobs and reinvesting in essential services.

Devonport City Council was pleased to work with the Devonport Chamber of Commerce in a range of new initiatives during the year; as well as welcoming Chamber's support for the City's and regional initiatives of LIVING CITY and the Cradle Mountain Master Plan.

The Chamber's focus on maximising Devonport's future growth potential and its shared vision for attracting further investment; developing new and unique customer experiences; growing our share of the tourism market and capitalising on our existing unique features, such as heritage, maritime, rail and waterfront; is to be strongly commended.

Council is committed to realising our vision of becoming the LIVING CITY and creating a resilient and robust local economy. Further funding was secured and a construction commencement on Stage 1 realised, after four intensive years of research, vision-shaping, community consultation and planning. The benefits that LIVING CITY will bring should not be under-estimated, with an independent report estimated \$112 million in additional annual economic activity as well as 830 on-going full time jobs, upon project completion.

We look forward to the opening of TasWater's new regional headquarters, in the southern end of Rooke Street, in the coming months and in welcoming their 120 strong workforce.

During the year the Chamber continued to work hard and think innovatively about how to support existing Devonport businesses in adapting to changes in relation to consumer expectations, the continued growth of the digital economy, the State and Federal Budgets, laws and the changing political landscape.

The Young Leaders Committee again played an active role in shaping our City events and provided a valuable opportunity for our young business leaders to actively participate and contribute to city life.

Whilst it was disappointing to realise the Renew Devonport initiative didn't have the necessary support to continue, it is pleasing that the Blue Apple Gift Store & Gallery has been a successful outcome of the project and continues to be a creative hub and retail outlet in East Devonport.

Statement of Accounting Policies

This financial report is a special purpose financial report prepared in order to satisfy the financial reporting requirements of the Associations Incorporations Act (Tas.) 1964 . The committee has determined that the association is not a reporting entity.

The financial report has been prepared in accordance with the requirements of the Associations Incorporation Act (Tas.) 1964 and the following Australian Accounting Standards:

AASB 1031: Materiality

AASB 110: Events Occurring After the Balance Sheet Date

The financial report has been prepared on an accruals basis and is based on historic costs and does not take into account changing money values, or current valuations of non-current assets.

The following is a summary of the material accounting policies adopted by the association in the preparation of the financial report. The policies have been consistently applied unless otherwise stated.

Property, plant and equipment

Property, plant and equipment are carried at cost. Depreciable items are depreciated over their expected useful life using the diminishing value method.

Income tax

The association is exempt from income tax under section 23(h) of the Income Tax Assessment Act (1997).

Goods and services tax (GST)

The net amount of GST recoverable from or payable to the Australian Taxation Office is included as a current asset or a current liability respectively in the balance sheet.

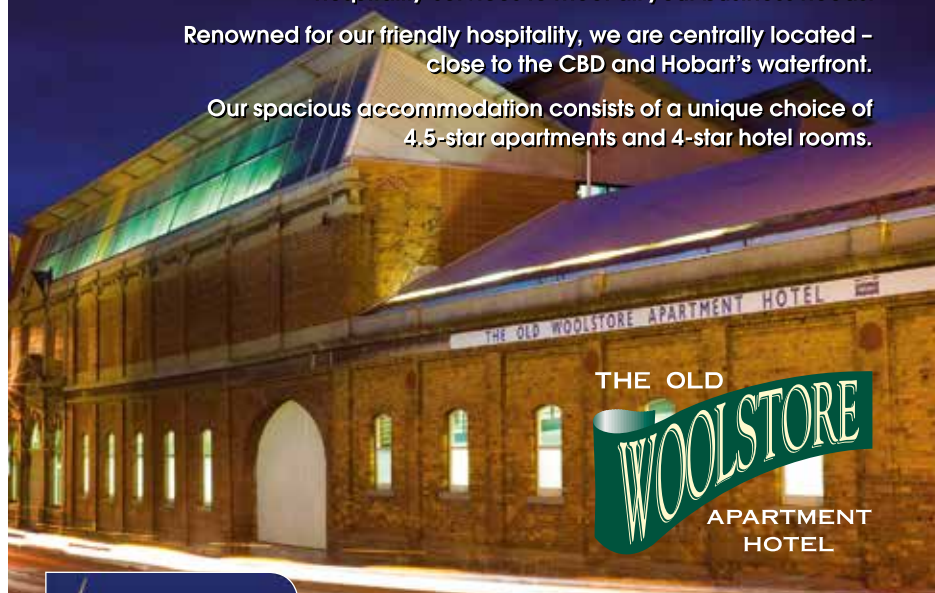

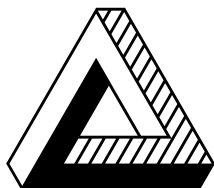
